True or False:

- 5.1 (F) National records may only be established in registered tournaments. (NRA 17.1)
- 5.2 (F) In the standing position NRA rules require the shooter to stand free with both feet on the ground or on a thin mat without any support. (NRA 5.12)
- 5.3 (T) A gun with the safety on guarantees it will not fire.
- 5.4 (F) Four common features of a good shooting position are: balance, bone support, comfort and legality.
- 5.5 (T) The standing position is the most stable of the four positions you shoot. (TL-p39,r)
- 5.6 (T) In the standing position both feet are together, facing 90 degrees to the target. (TL-p10,r)
- 5.7 (T) A kneeling roll must measure not more than six inches long or eight inches in diameter. (NRA 3.14.1)
- 5.8 (T) When a shot hole cuts or touches the edge of a bullseye or scoring ring of a target, it is given the lower value. (NRA 14.3)
- 5.9 (T) Preparation period is 10 minutes. (NRA 10.3.1)
- 5.10 (F) Using proper sight alignment your shots should fall in a group on the target. (TL-p22,r)
- 5.11 (F) Time limit for 5-meter 10-bull competition is one minute per record shot. (NRA 8.1)
- 5.12 (T) In all positions the butt of the gun must rest against the front of the shoulder and may touch the ground. (NRA 5.6)
- 5.13 (T) No more than two coaches are allowed on the firing line for each shooter. (NRA 6.7)
- 5.14 (F) Upon the command of "CEASE FIRE" all guns must be grounded. (NRA 10.1.4)
- 5.15 (F) The first sighting shot outside of the sighting bullseye guard ring will be scored as a miss unless you ~~bring~~ bring it to the attention of the Range Officer. (NRA 9.3.1)
- 5.16 (F) Total value of all required shots fired by a competitor in any one match is the "shooting score". (NRA 14.0)
- 5.17 (F) Always keeps your trigger finger off the trigger and outside the trigger guard until you are sighted on the target and ready to fire.
- 5.18 (T) The major difference between a shotgun and rifle is the type of action each one uses. (TL-p7,r)
